



Latest News on Bay Area Commuter Benefits Program

San Francisco Bay Area employers with 50 or more full-time employees within the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (Air District) geographic boundaries are required to register and offer commuter benefits to their employees by September 30, 2014 in order to comply with the Bay Area Commuter Benefits Program. Employers that have not registered by September 30 are required to register now. Through Employers with fewer than 50 Bay Area employees may be subject to a local commuter benefits ordinance.








Budget FY 2015-2016 – Revenue (\$3.65M)
