- II. Transit projects

- III. Other transportation improvements
  - a. Transportation demand management
  - b. Shuttles
  - c. System upgrades and improvements

After the groups and topics are assigned the members will get their food from the buffet and go to work.

For each group there will be a facilitator, a recorder, and a reporter. Individuals are asked to take one of the following questions and provide their own perspective for the other members of the group.

- 1. What is the current role of C/CAG in this area and how does membership in C/CAG benefit our local jurisdictions?
- 2. What should C/CAG be doing more of in this area? Do less of? Do differently?
- 3. What should C/CAG be doing in the future where should we be headed?

- II. Abandoned Vehicle Abatement and Airport Land Use
- III Storm Water Pollution Prevention

Each of the groups will also discuss an additional topic –

  - a. Parks
  - b. Animal control
  - c. Smart growth
  - d. Mosquito Abatement

The three questions from the previous session are used to focus the discussion.
