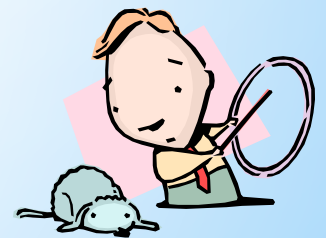


* What does this mean to a local agency?

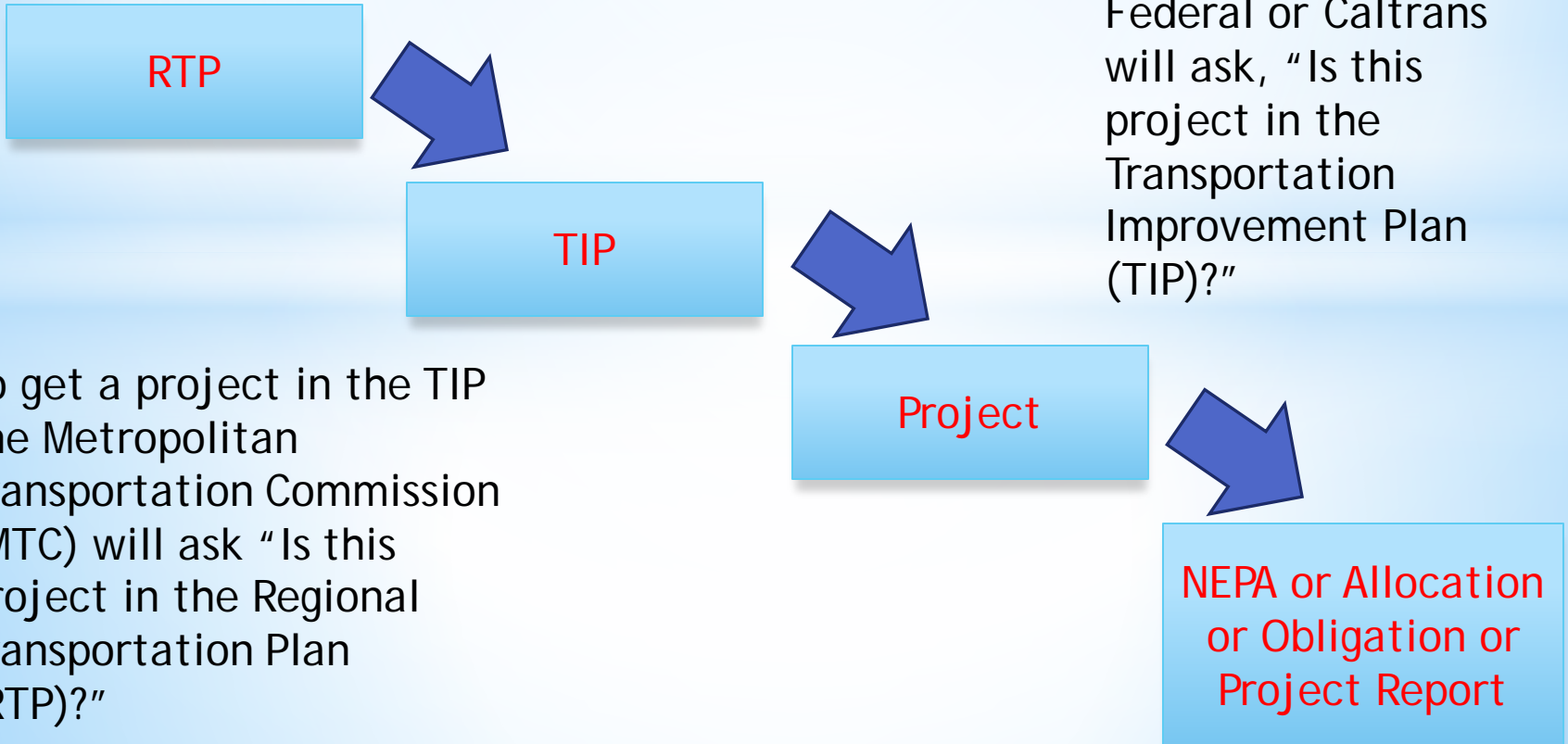
For local agencies the important part of Plan Bay Area is to get important transportation projects into the plan. Projects that need to be included in the plan are:

- Projects that will receive Federal or State Funding
- Projects that will require Federal Action (e.g. NEPA)
- Projects with significant air quality impacts.
- Projects that are of regional significance.

Even 100% local funded may need to be in the plan for air quality analysis.

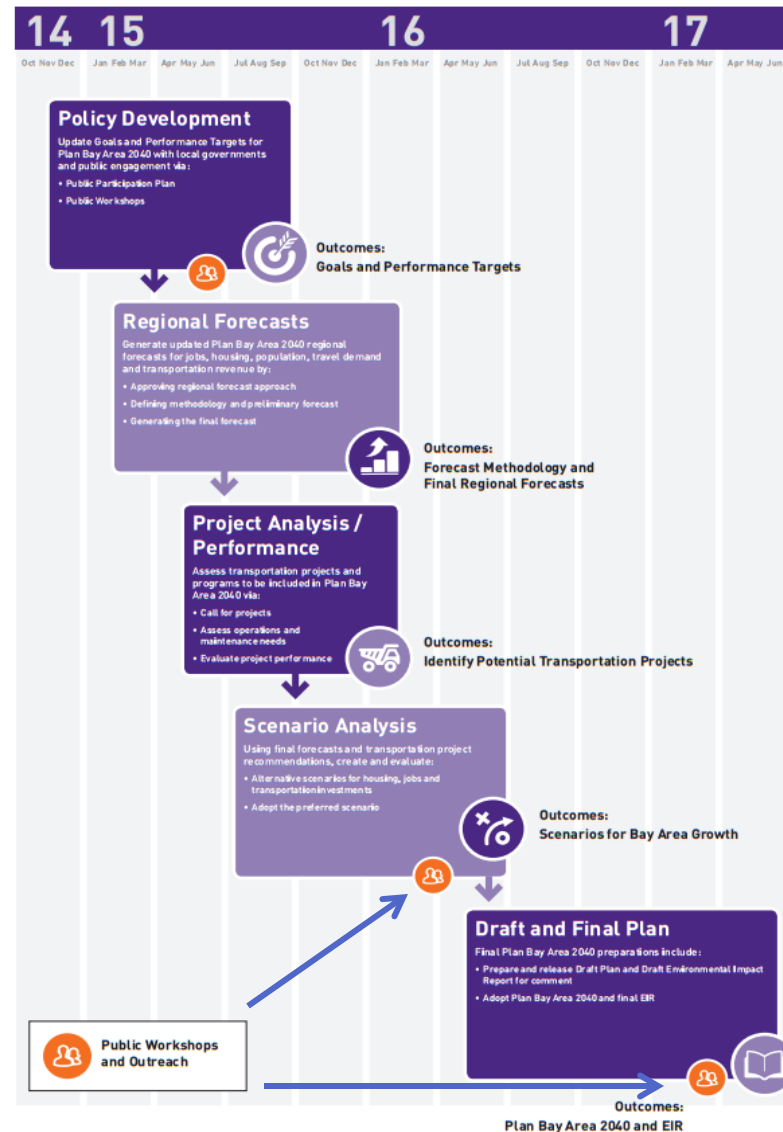
