MRP Provision C.10 Trash Load Reduction

- Trash Load Reduction
 - 40% by 2014
 - 60% by 2016 (performance guideline)
 - 70% by 2017
 - 80% by 2019
 - 100% by 2022
- Mandatory Full Capture Systems
- Receiving Water Monitoring Program
- Annual Creek/Shoreline Cleanups
- Maintain Long-Term Plan



Trash Load Reduction

% Reductions

- Baseline (2009) vs. Current Trash Generation
- Trash Generation Maps (Baseline)
- Current Trash Reductions determined by:
 - 1. Extent of Full Capture System Treatment
 - On-land Visual Assessment Results (Other Actions)
 - Demonstrable reductions via Source Controls
 - Product-related ordinances
 - 4. Additional Creek and Shoreline Cleanups





Extent of Full Capture

San Mateo Countywide

- All member agencies achieved mandatory minimum treatment areas
- Over 2,300 acres of moderate, high, and very high trash generating areas treated to-date
- Enhanced maintenance and operation tracking and reporting
- ~25% trash reduction due to full capture systems







On-land Visual Assessments

 Method used to account for trash reductions from actions other than full capture systems



San Mateo Countywide

- Over 1,000 assessments conducted to-date
- >190 miles of streets/sidewalks
- ~37% trash reduction observed todate



Source Controls

- Reusable bag ordinances
- Expanded polystyrene food service ware ordinances
- 10% trash reduction for most member agencies
 - Maximum allowed under MRP 2.0







Additional Creek and Shoreline Cleanups

- Offsets for those above and beyond MRP 2.0 required creek and shoreline "hot spot" cleanups
- 3:1 offset
- Maximum 10% reduction allowed under MRP 2.0
- Reductions vary among member agencies





Summary of SMCWPPP Member Agency Trash Reductions in FY 15-16 (DRAFT)

- Member agency Annual Reports currently under development/review (due September 30th)
- Based on review to-date, at least 12 of 21 member agencies have achieved >60% reduction
- Load reductions for all other SMCWPPP member agencies still under review
- For those member agencies that cannot demonstrate a 60% reduction:
 - Develop and submit "action plan" with their annual report that describes actions that will be taken to achieve a 70% by July 1, 2017
