Including Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Travis, and Williamson counties

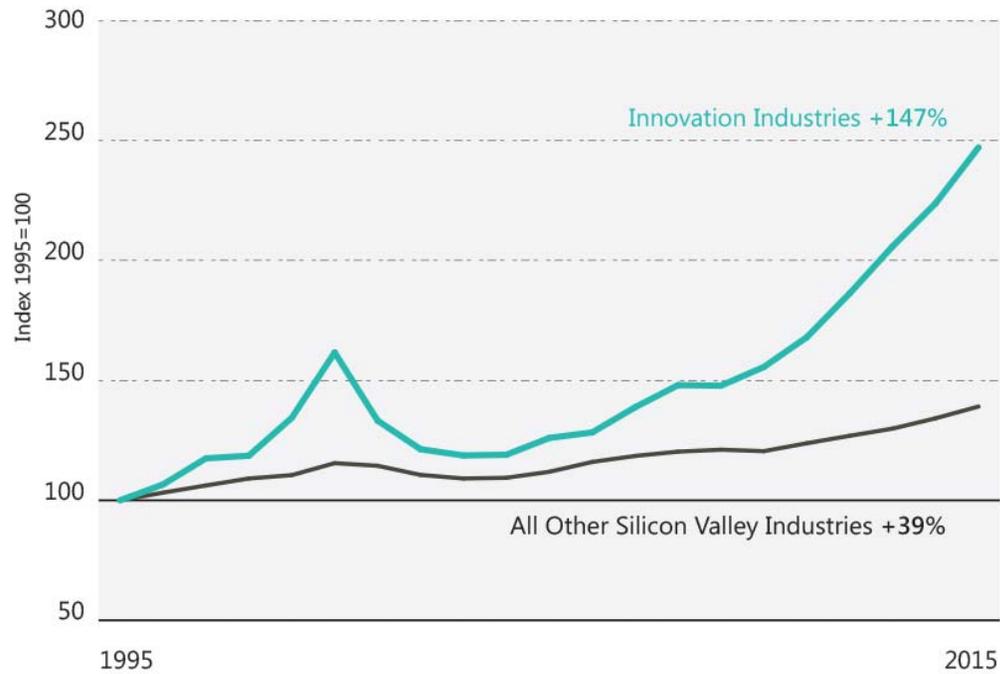
### **SEATTLE**

Innovation Industries and All Other Industries Silicon Valley, 1995=100



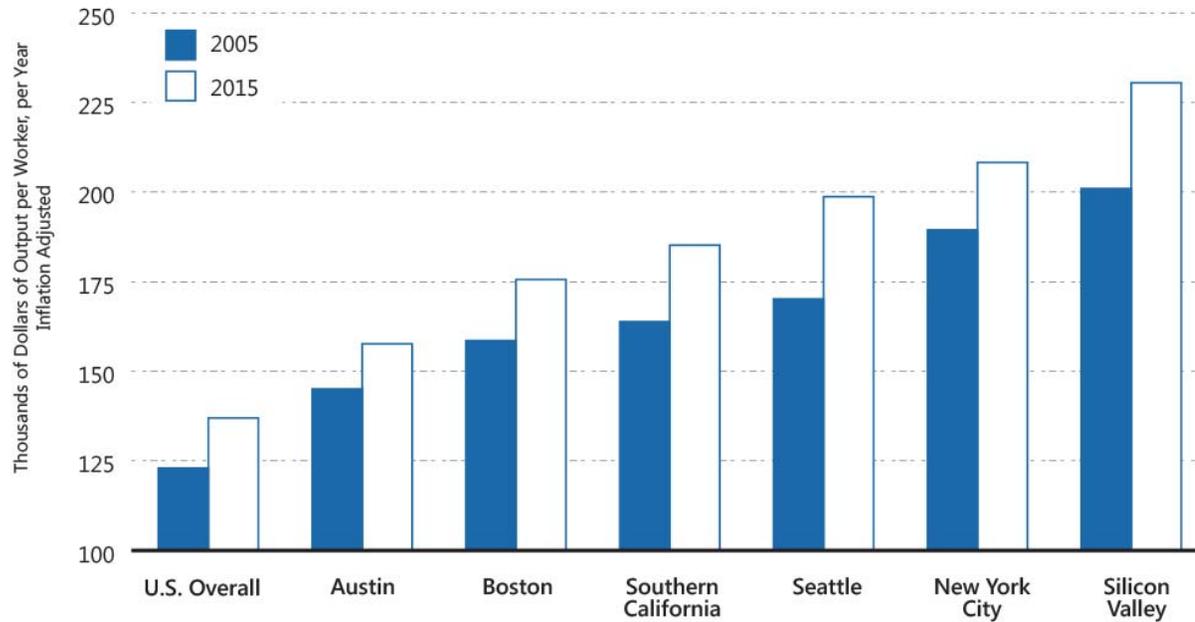

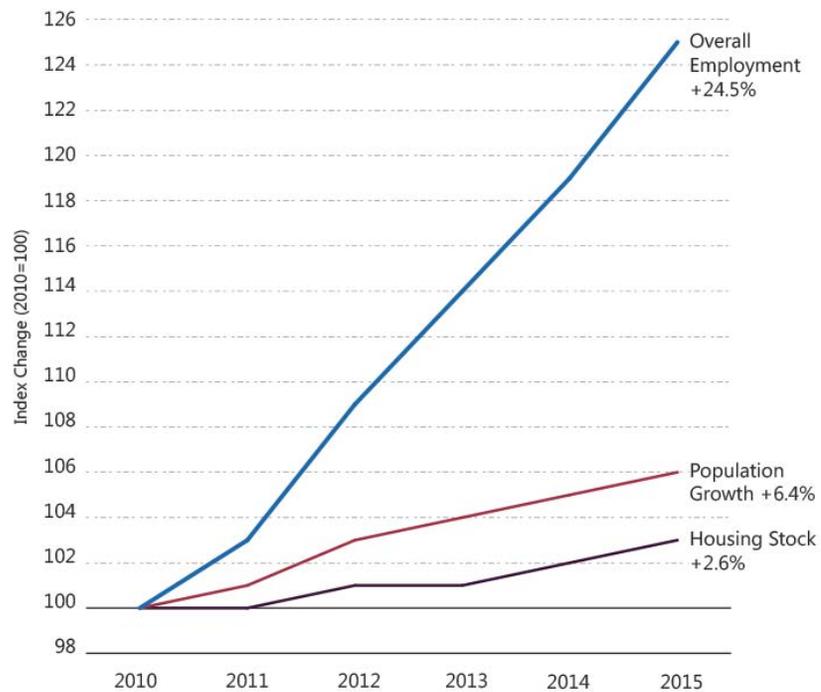

## Silicon Valley Progress in Meeting Housing Need Allocation By Income, 2007-2014

Counties	Very Low Income Households (0-50% of AMI*)	Low Income Households (50-80% of AMI)	Moderate Income Households (80-120% of AMI)	Higher Income Households (Above 120% of AMI)
San Francisco	59%	27%	18%	109%
San Mateo	20%	25%	25%	93%
Santa Clara	27%	28%	22%	139%

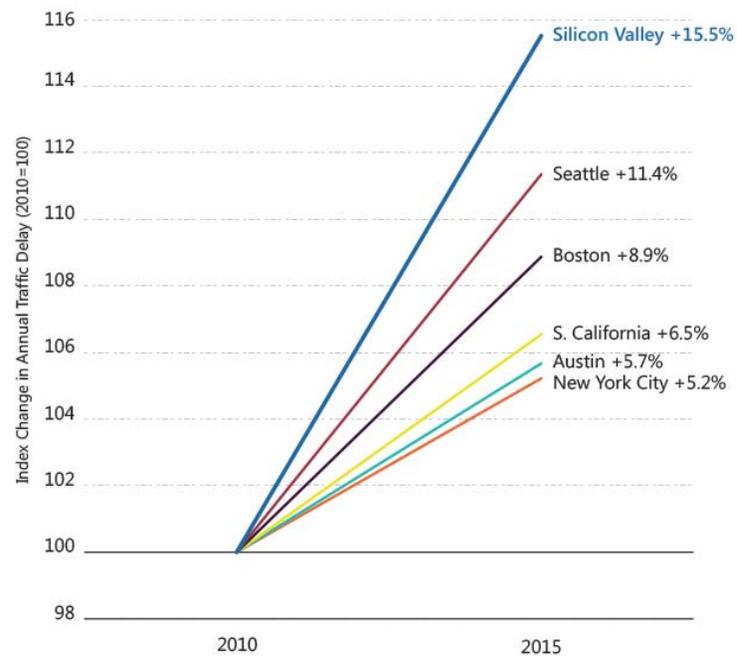

Innovation Regions, 2010 and 2015 (Index 2010=100)

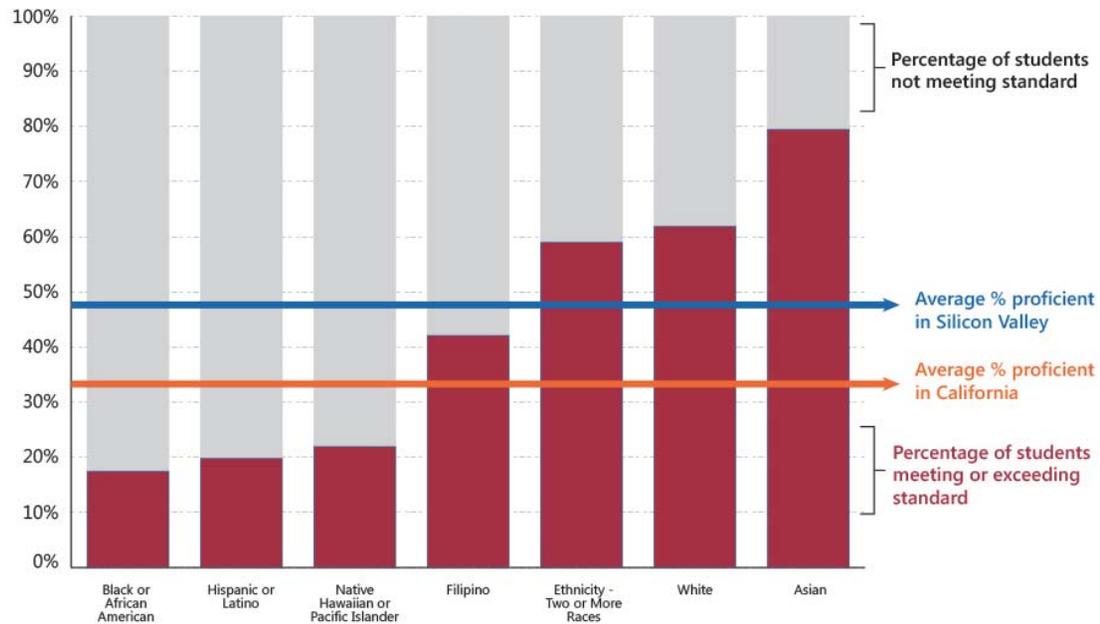


Reflects commute times for workers employed in the innovation regions

# Legislative Solutions

## HOUSING

- **SB 35 (Wiener): *Housing Accountability and Affordability Act*** – Expedites affordable housing construction by streamlining approval criteria in communities with unmet affordable housing needs.
- **AB 1505 (Bloom): *Restoring Local Discretion in Designing Inclusionary Housing Programs Act*** – Restores ability of local government to require the provision of affordable rental housing if so desired

## Immigration

- **SB 6 (Hueso): *Due Process For All Act*** – Creates new pool of dedicated funding for qualified immigrants to have legal representation during deportation proceedings.
