Walk audits were conducted in three high priority schools, as indicated in Creating Safer Streets Near Schools, the 2017 report from San Mateo County Health Planning and Policy. Walk audit participants included school personnel, district personnel, law enforcement, CBO's, parents, students, San Mateo County public health, the county office of education and elected officials. The walk audits were led by Mark Fenton, a public health, planning, and transportation consultant. BACKGROUND

Every two years C/CAG, as the Congestion Management Agency for San Mateo County, is required to monitor the performance of the Congestion Management Program (CMP) roadway system and conduct other activities to determine compliance with the CMP. The CMP roadway system that is monitored includes 16 signalized intersections and 53 roadway segments located throughout the county. As part of the CMP requirements and legislation, historically only vehicle counts are taken at the sixteen CMP intersections. The last monitoring update was performed in 2017.

New for the 2019 update in addition to the vehicle counts, C/CAG also performed pedestrian and bicycle volume counts at the sixteen (16) signalized intersections during the AM and PM peak periods. Table I below shows the list of CMP intersections.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

The TDA Article Call for Projects was issued on May 10, 2019. TDA Article 3 Project Applications will be due July 25, 2019 at 5:00 PM. Since the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) does not meet until September 26, 2019, submitted applications will be dispersed to members of the committee by C/CAG either via email PDF or mailed hard copy. At the September 26th meeting, the BPAC will receive presentations of projects from cities. BPAC will then score the projects during the October 24, 2019 meeting. Project proposals with the highest score will then be presented to the C/CAG board for approval.

Members of the BPAC will elect how they would like to receive the project proposals for review during the July and August recess. C/CAG is able to release the applications either electronically via email PDF, mail a hard copy of the applications, or send both.

Members of the BPAC will elect a date for proposed project site visits either between July 26th and September 25th or between September 27th and October 23rd. Members of the BPAC will elect a field tour date decidedly on whether members would prefer to meet prior or following city presentations of project proposals. The BPAC will arrange project field tours in accordance with the project timeline and the coincidence of BPAC meeting recesses in July and August.
