3. Meeting Minutes of April 25, 2019

Approved. Chair Self called for a motion to approve the April 25, 2019, Meeting Minutes.

4. Receive a presentation on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) Seamless Mobility Program (Information)

Kara Oberg from MTC presented on MTC's plan to improve traveler experience through an interconnected, multimodal transportation network to reduce vehicle miles traveled and achieve Plan Bay Area goals through the integration of "Seamless Mobility".

5. Receive a presentation on the Safe Routes to School – Bicycle and Pedestrian Audit for specific school sites (Information)

Theresa Vallez-Kelly from San Mateo County's Office of Education presented on walk audits that were performed for three high priority schools, as indicated in Creating Safer Streets Near Schools, the 2017 report from San Mateo County Health Planning and Policy. She included information on who attended the audits and who led. The audits resulted in an increase in collaboration between city and its respective schools.

6. Receive information on pedestrian and bicycle counts in conjunction with the Congestion Management Program (CMP) report (Information)

Jeffrey Lacap from C/CAG gave a presentation on the resulting counts in conjunction with the CMP report. With 16 signalized intersections, the 2019 update of the CMP included the introduction of bicycle and pedestrian counts along with vehicle counts. The counts will be used to inform the different modes of transportation that are being utilized in San Mateo County and help inform the update to the San Mateo Countywide Comprehensive Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.

7. Review and recommend the Transportation Development Act Article 3 for Fiscal Year 2019/20 Cycle Scheduled Project Site Visit Dates for Project Proposals (Action)

RECOMMENDATION

That the BPAC receive presentations from the applicants on the proposed projects for the Transportation Development Act (TDA) Article 3 Fiscal Year 2019/20 Cycle.

FISCAL IMPACT

The TDA Article 3 FY 2019/20 Cycle budget is \$1,950,000. The presentations do not have any fiscal impacts.

SOURCE OF FUNDS

TDA Article 3 funds are derived from the following sources:

- Local Transportation Funds (LTF), derived from a ¼ cent of the general sales tax collected statewide
- State Transit Assistance fund (STA), derived from the statewide sales tax on gasoline and diesel fuel.

BACKGROUND

The TDA Article Call for Projects was issued on May 10, 2019, soliciting local jurisdictions to submit applications for bicycle and pedestrian related projects. TDA Article 3 Project Applications were due on July 25, 2019. C/CAG received 2 planning applications and 12 capital applications from a total of 13 jurisdictions. The total amount requested from all applications was \$4,346,541.35 of which \$145,117.35 was requested for planning and \$4,201,424.00 was requested for capital projects. The total funding available is \$1,750,000.00 for capital projects and \$200,000 for planning projects.

Members of the BPAC will receive presentations from each applicant describing the proposed project. Each presenter will have 6 minutes to present with 2 minutes following the presentation for questions for a total of 8 minutes. The presentation schedule is as follows.
