

Transportation In frastructure

SMC Express Lanes – (Santa Clara County Line to I-380 open and under construction). Uses pricing to promote carpooling, shuttles, and transit, increases throughput, and invests in equity.

Managed Lanes North of I-380 – (In planning) upon completion will have a managed lane the entire 30-mile length of 101.

92/101 Area Improvements, Direct Connector, 1.2 Mile Bike Lanes- smooth traffic flow, add mobility hub, promote bike use





Tool for Cities and County

VMT/GHG Mitigation Tools Program – menu of measures to reduce VMT and address CEQA requirement for mitigating project GHG emissions, direct benefits to disadvantaged communities

<u>StreeLight Data</u> – Joint subscription for city and County planners to use to evaluate VMT of proposed projects for compliance






Plans and Policies

<u>Policy</u> – TDM policy used by most cities in SMC that encourages alternative modes and trip reduction strategies with a goal of 25% to 35% reduction in trips, which in turn will reduce VMT and GHG.

Alternative Fuels Readiness Plan (AFRP) – Plan that presents potential alternative vehicle fuels for transportation, opportunities for reducing emissions, safety considerations, and financial incentives





Traffic Management

<u>Smart Corridor</u> – Proactive Incident Management System that maximizes efficiency of the existing transportation network, smoothing traffic flow, reduced idling and GHG, improved safety, and reduced travel times.

<u>Traffic Signal Coordination</u>— with SamTrans for Bus priority

<u>Belmont</u> – Adaptive signal system <u>East Palo Alto</u> – Signal priority project





Bike Racks on Busses

Funding Public Transportation

<u>Shuttles</u> – C/CAG provides approximately \$2.6m per year for transit and shuttles

Commute.org - C/CAG provides approximately
\$1.2m per year to support Commute.org

<u>Carpool Programs</u> - Carpool In San Mateo County! - mobile carpooling apps to increase local carpool ridership during peak travel periods

<u>Lifeline Transportation Program</u> – designed to help low-income residents by funding transportation projects that will improve their mobility within the community



<u>Shared Mobility</u> – completing a feasibility study and developing a pilot

Active Transportation


<u>Safe Routes to Schools</u> – program to promote active transportation for parents and students

Comprehensive Bike/Ped Master Plan –
Completed last year, give direction to key
program opportunities for San Mateo County,
online maps of community circumstances

<u>Buffered Bike Lane Projects</u> – multiple projects in pipeline along El Camino in San Mateo County, recent \$760K for San Bruno/Millbrae section

TDA Article 3 – funding specifically for bike and ped projects

QuickBuild/OBAG 3 - opportunity to leverage ready infrastructure and design

<u>Sustainable Street Master Plan</u> – integrating green infrastructure and active transportation improvements, 500+ locations identified

<u>SRTS Pilot Projects</u> – 10 Pilot Projects for green streets and SRTS at different locations around SMC, at Intersections and for connectivity

<u>Green Infrastructure</u> – developing its role in sequestration and current role in capturing toxics







Housing - Transportation

21 Elements – C/CAG and the Dept. of Housing started the regional award winning 21-Elements Efforts that housing-transit connection, resources for cities and County – housing law, RHNA, ADUs ...

Energy - Climate

<u>RICAPS</u> – Templates, tools, technical assistance, emission inventories for cities and County for climate action planning

San Mateo County Energy Watch – energy efficiency and fuel switching project identification and referral for agencies (cities, County, special districts, K-12 schools, small hard-to-reach business
