- Volunteers transport fresh produce via bike trailer






Education and Social Programming





People walking and biking on El Camino Real / Mission

El Camino Real is 1% of streets in San Mateo County

10% of collisions involving a person walking or biking in SMC happened on ECR

20% of the fatal collisions were on ECR

Why Bike and Walk on El Camino Real?




- Best north-south route provides direct, continuous access

- People are already using it need for safety





Prioritizing Livable Communities & Partnerships

Work with community partners to advocate for **effective public transit**, **affordable housing**, **and smarter parking policies** so our communities have jobs, housing, and services **closer together and within easy reach by bicycle**.

SVBC is partnering with the San Mateo County Housing Leadership Council and Peninsula For Everyone to host an affordable housing infrastructure ride from South San Francisco to Millbrae.

In 2022, SVBC, Palo Alto Forward, Silicon Valley Leadership Group, and Housing Trust Silicon Valley organized an affordable housing infrastructure ride together, featuring housing developments along El Camino Real.



Prioritizing Livable Communities & Partnerships



SVBC is participating in "<u>Complete Streets</u>" workshops organized by Smart Growth America (SGA).

In addition to the workshops, the organization will provide \$15k to help South City fund a temporary "quick build" or "pop up" facility on ECR. Create a network of east-west and north-south bicycle routes, with a **focus on making El Camino Real safe and accessible**.

Expedite projects using quick builds and pilots and relentlessly **push agencies to shorten timelines from planning to construction.**
