

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
Plan Overview/Refresher

- Countywide Local Roadway Safety Plan (LRSP) follows national best practices and includes:
 - C/CAG Safety Vision and Goals
 - Refers to all jurisdictions' vision/goals
 - Crash data analysis and safety emphasis areas
 - Prioritized Recommendations:
 - Engineering countermeasures
 - Priority project scopes
 - Policy/program/coordination
 - Evaluation/Implementation framework

TAC	Desire to measure implementation and success	 Provided framework for implementation in the Plan Recommended continuation of Advisory group as Countywide Transportation Safety Advisory Committee (TSAC)
CMEQ, BPAC, Board	Concerns/questions about effect of autonomous vehicles (AVs)	-Added latest available language from USDOT related to AVs and safety (see p. 11) -This can be an ongoing topic for the TSAC (see pp. 55-56)
CMEQ, BPAC	Ideas for additional data to improve safety planning (e.g. near-miss data, pavement quality data)	Recommended data quality enhancement studies for C/CAG on behalf of jurisdictions (see table 11 and pp. 64-70)

Committee / Stakeholder	What We Heard	Actions Taken
BPAC, Board	Desire to prioritize social equity impacts	Added more emphasis in Plan introduction (see p. 12)
TAC, Board	Plan to update local and county plans in future	TSAC and C/CAG will coordinate with local agencies to agree on future update schedules (5 years or fewer)
TAC	Existing plan will expire within the next 5 years. What should we do?	Local jurisdictions may adopt local resolution cosigning onto Countywide LRSP and note proposed actions as interim measure
BART	LRSP should include public transportation access	Added BART to the TSAC group and incorporated plan comments
SamTrans	SamTrans desire to prioritize bus stops for safety improvement	Coordinated to incorporate countywide bus stop prioritization
