


## FY25 Comparison – Draft to Final

		Beginning Balance	Revenues	Expend.	Ending Balance
	Draft 2024-25	\$39.2	\$19.6	\$39.5	\$19.2
	Final 2024-25	\$38.8	\$21.3	\$40.3	\$19.8
	Difference	(\$0.3)	\$1.8	\$0.8	\$0.6



#### Summary of Changes – Draft to Final

- Revenues: ↑\$1.8M
  - Transportation programs up \$1.7M
    - Federal reimbursements increase by \$1.4M
      - Will deplete 5-year federal allocation faster
    - Added \$300K of State Transportation Improvement Program funds
- Expenditures: ↑\$800K
  - Measure M distribution increases by \$650K
  - TFCA distribution go up by \$200K


#### Revenue Projections

- 1. Staff are working on sensitivity tests of revenue sources.
- 2. Staff are stretched thin to take advantage of new State and Federal funding opportunities, but without commensurate increases in Operating revenue. C/CAG transportation operating revenue (Member Fees, CRP Fees, MTC Planning funds, STIP Planning Funds) have not had material increases for many years.
- 3. C/CAG will likely expend all of the MTC Planning funds before the next OBAG 4 cycle begins in FY 2026.
- 4. Future discussions of potential <u>future</u> options will include:
- a) Utilizing existing fund balances.
- b) Repayment schedule of Express Lane Operating Loan.
- c) Allocating more of the next OBAG 4 funding (FY 26) for planning support.
- d) Other revenue stabilization/diversification strategies.





#### **Federal Transportation Funding**



Federal funding for transportation programs expected to be fully expended before end of grant period; gap will require different source of funding



#### FY24 Equity Plan Implementation Highlights

• 21 of the 36 action items have been completed, substantially completed and/or are underway.

#### **Some Highlights:**

- a) Distributed the adopted Equity Plan to all local elected officials
- b) Created and utilized an CBO database for community engagement
- c) Integrated equity language to job descriptions
- d) Added equity sections to all Board and most committee staff reports
- e) Incorporated Equity Focused Areas (EFAs) in call for projects and plans
- f) Issued \$4.5m Lifeline Transportation Call for projects targeting Equity Priority Communities and EFAs
- g) Included funding in the proposed budget and in various funding requests for ongoing Equity Assessment implementation.
