State Transit Assistance (STA) County Block Grant Overview

• In 2018, MTC established the STA County Block Grant program to be administered by County Transportation Agencies (CTA's)

- STA funds are generated from the diesel fuel sales tax.
- Previously, MTC distributed funding via 1) Bay Area Northern County small transit operators, 2) regional Paratransit, 3) the regional Lifeline Transportation Program, and 4) MTC regional coordination programs.

 New Block Grant Program allows counties to determine how to invest in paratransit services and lifeline transportation needs

C/CAG STA County Block Grant Framework

- Since 2018-19, C/CAG has continued with the historical distribution:
 - o 37% of population based STA funds to SamTrans Paratransit Program
 - 63% of population based STA funds to Lifeline Transportation Program
- Estimated \$4.5M of STA funds was available for the C/CAG Lifeline Transportation Program Cycle 7



C/CAG Lifeline Transportation Program Cycle 7

- Program aimed to support transit projects that improve mobility for low-income residents
- Projects awarded funding have been identified in community-based transportation planning (CBTP) process and other local planning efforts for disadvantaged communities.
- Public agencies and non-profits require a pass-through funding agreement with a transit agency (i.e. SamTrans)
- Project examples include: shuttle service, transit stop improvements, purchase of transit passes, New, continued or expanded fixed-route transit service, etc.
