On behalf of C/CAG, I am writing to express our strong support for the Town of Colma's application, submitted in partnership with the City of South San Francisco, to the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) for the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program. Additionally, the project will support future infill housing development in the area.

To meet its goals, the Project will carry out comprehensive street upgrades, featuring continuous sidewalks, protected bike lanes, ADA-compliant curb ramps, high-visibility crosswalks, enhanced street lighting, landscaping, stormwater management systems, bus stop enhancements, and new traffic signals. These upgrades will integrate with regional transit options, such as bus service along El Camino Real and connections to the Colma and South San Francisco BART stations.
