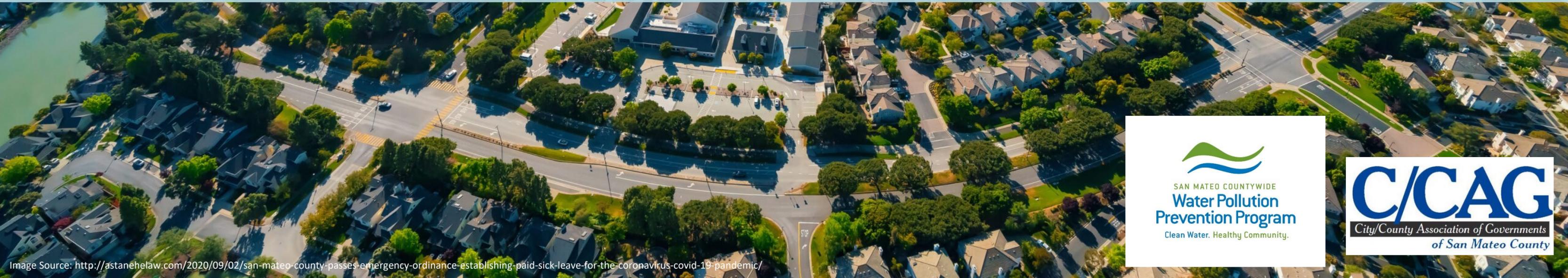

Countywide Stormwater Program Background

Regulatory compliance program to address federal and state municipal stormwater requirements mandated by the Clean Water Act and Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act

Support 22 agencies in San Mateo County in meeting Municipal Regional Permit requirements administered by the San Francisco Bay Water Quality Control Board

Funded by Property Tax Fees (\$1.8 million) and a portion of \$10 Vehicle Registration Fee (\$1M)



Countywide Stormwater Program Background

Two full-time staff & consultants


Primary areas of support:

- Local program implementation
- Do compliance directly for member agencies
- Participate in regional efforts

Focus on supporting compliance needs and advancing countywide and regional efforts to enhance climate resilience and adaptation with respect to water infrastructure and resources

Explore and analyze projected climate impacts to potentially vulnerable infrastructure assets across various water resources sectors in San Mateo County.


Climate Scenario

100% Trash Reduction Compliance

Municipalities must demonstrate 100% trash reduction/no adverse impact to waterways by June 30, 2025

Compliance through full trash capture installation and on-land controls demonstrating “low” trash generation (source controls)

Most municipalities achieved the goal by June, several will achieve it by Dec/Jan and three will require additional time but are very close

>12,000 acres controlled and tens of millions in local, state and federal funds spent in San Mateo



Rain Barrel Rebate Campaign


FY25-26 (4th year) Bulk Distribution Events

Daly City (Nov 1) – 133 barrels sold

Half Moon Bay (Nov 8) – 99 barrels sold

Participants pre order discounted barrels and apply for C/CAG/BAWSCA rebates (potential for full cost recovery)

Seeking ~2 willing partner agencies for distribution events/year



School Partnerships

FY24-25 Rain Barrel Installation at Green Hills Elementary School, Millbrae

14 projects to-date over 6 years

Partnership with County Office of Education and Environmental Literacy Program

Seeking ~2 partnering schools per year

Supports C/CAG/BAWSCA rain barrel rebate program with community workshops



Future Challenges

Reissued MRP is scheduled for July 1, 2027

Subsequent 5-year permits typically increase requirements + costs


Agencies lack dedicated stormwater funding (both local agencies and C/CAG):

- Average single-family home pays about \$8/year to the Countywide Stormwater Program
- Not all agencies have local fees and for those that do, most not updated since 1990s)

Likely need to reduce scope of services for Countywide Stormwater Program starting next Fiscal Year

Continue seeking grants to offset compliance costs and evaluating dedicated revenue options




